**Joyce Eesley** and **Steve Horvath** will be participating in a two person exhibition, titled "Two for the Show" at the Richeson Gallery in Kimberley, WI September 28 – December 5, 2015. They have diametrically opposed viewpoints relative to how they approach their work. Joyce's carefully rendered images of flora, shiny vases and glassware is carefully composed and beautifully lit compositions (see *Grape Reflections*) whereas Steve's pastoral compositions have a very loose impressionistic application of fully charged brushes of gouache keeping his images energized and fluid (see *Lake Park Lagoon*).

Perhaps it is the wide variation in their approach to painting that makes this exhibition especially interesting.

## **Artist Profile**

**Quick Sketch – Alice Struck** By *Steve Horvath*

**Mequon, Wisconsin**, August 3, 2015 – Alice had a desire to be an artist since she was a child. She made art throughout her formative years into high school where she not only made art but started to exhibit as well. She began to turn her desire into realty after graduation from Wauwatosa High School by enrolling in art at UW Milwaukee's Fine Art program as a painting major. She married during college and started her family while beginning her advanced degree in Art Therapy at Mt. Mary College. It soon became apparent that starting a family and pursuing an education at the same time was not going to be an option. While in college Alice secured a job at the Bel Air Health Care Center so she could continue to pursue her degree at Mt. Mary College. (A requirement at that time). With college completed she stayed on at Bel Air that was later to become Wellspring of Milwaukee where she is still working today. During this time she found herself divorced and raising her 2 boys Michael and Andrew. (They have become an Ophthalmologist and the Ozaukee County Planning and Parks Director respectively).

Alice said she has found a real joy in art therapy but has always had the strong desire to produce her own work as well and has done so throughout these years. And she is not limited to watercolors alone. She wanted to decorate a room in her home and decided to paint a tree on the wall from floor to ceiling using a leaf stamp to finish off the foliage. Alice is currently working on a very large painting at the request of her son Andrew that he wanted painted to represent many different species of plants.



In addition to that she has several watercolor commissions she is working on. Besides having served as President of the Art Therapy Association for 2 years she has taught art at Mt. Mary College, Marion College in Fond du Lac, served as Director of the Donna Lexa Community Art Center in West Bend, and for the past 17 years has been teaching art on Saturday at the Cedarburg Cultural Center as well as serving on their board.

Alice loves her home studio and her neighborhood and plans to remodel the basement into a home gallery for her work. She sells her work, as many artist do, on her website and by attending a few select art fairs in the area during the summer and, of course, her commissions. I happened to catch up with her at the Cedarburg Strawberry Festival and Art Fair where she had a canopy set up offering her artwork for sale. Alice makes art in her tidy home studio in Mequon. All of her tools and supplies are within easy reach of her drawing board where she stands to paint. She begins her work with a detailed drawing of her subject, especially important for her architectural subjects, before she begins adding watercolor to her paper.

Alice says she uses good quality materials and is not afraid to use other materials such as cellophane for texture and paper toweling to remove areas of color. She even took an old brush stiffened from dried on masking medium and cut the tip down with scissors and found the desired effect she needed to give the impression of leaves on trees. Alice is a very busy person with her art therapy work, her painting, teaching, and commissions. She says she'll retire in a few years giving her more time to devote to making art and, as she has been doing for many years, continuing the long tradition of camping with her family in Door County.
