Annual Membership Meeting Election and Demonstration

Our Annual Member Meeting and election will take place this year at the Cedarburg Cultural Center April 4 at 12:00pm. It will be preceded by a WWS Board Meeting. Following our election we will have a watercolor demonstration at 1:00 - 3:00pm. We are excited to feature outstanding landscape artist, **Andy Evansen** who is nationally recognized.

Andy Evansen's interest in art started in childhood, as he can't recall a time when he wasn't drawing. He began painting watercolors in the mid 1990s as a change of pace from his career as a medical illustrator. He captured the landscape with an economy of brushstroke, taking advantage of the luminosity of watercolors done in just a few washes. Andy painted everyday scenes in such a way that revealed a hidden beauty, subjects that many would simply pass by.

Andy's work gained recognition after winning an international watercolor competition through American Artist magazine, appearing on their cover in 2005. He's been featured in numerous other publications since, and has become a sought-after workshop instructor who paints and teaches internationally.

He became a signature member of the prestigious Plein Air Painters of America (PAPA) in 2012 and served as their President from 2015-2017. His paintings have won numerous awards, including the Bronze and High Winds Medals from the American Watercolor Society, and he was their demonstration artist for the 2018 Exhibition. Andy is a signature member of AWS, PAPA, RRWS and TWSA.

Guests are welcome to this free demonstration. This is a good opportunity to invite a fellow artists who might be a potential candidate for membership.

Monet and Chicago May 10 – September 7, 2020

From the 1880s on, Chicago welcomed the "Father of Impressionism" with open arms When Monet's paintings first appeared alongside his contemporaries' in a Chicago gallery in 1888, he was singled out for praise by the press. And when his works were shown in the city again as part of the Inter-State Industrial Exposition in Chicago in 1890, they not only captured the eye of local collectors—they ignited a collective passion. In Memoriam

Nita Engle, 1925 - 2019



MARQUETTE, MI – Nita J. Engle, age 93, of Marquette, renowned watercolor artist, passed away August 29, 2019. Nita was raised in Marquette and attended the local schools. She attended Northern Normal for a year, where she majored in art. Nita moved to Chicago and enrolled in the Chicago Art Institute to pursue her lifelong passion of becoming an artist. She apprenticed and began freelancing, first with a wallpaper company and then with a newspaper and ad agency where she became art director. Through all her jobs, she learned and advanced in her knowledge and technique.

Nita entered some of her watercolors in national shows and was noticed by the publishers of Reader's Digest. She finally landed a job with Reader's Digest as an illustrator. The job entailed traveling to various parts of the country to sketch scenes for their stories. Through her entering shows and her affiliation with Reader's Digest, Nita began being recognized and received letters from Japan, Australia, and other countries. Soon, doors began to open for her and all kinds of opportunities presented themselves, including doing some work for Playboy. Over the years, she resided in New York, San Francisco, England, and Chicago, traveled all over the United States, and conducted workshops around the world including Italy, Bali, Tahiti, and Africa. However, the place that captured her heart and soul was Lake Superior.

In 1977, Nita returned to the Marquette area and set up a studio overlooking Lake Superior. Workshops continued in Marquette and Negaunee and countless students were given a whole new realm of expression through watercolors. She received many honors and awards over the years, including induction into the American Watercolor Society, "Artist of the Year" in 1984, named Art Master by American Artist Magazine in 1996, Honorary Doctorate from Northern Michigan University in 1986, induction into the US ART's Hall of Fame in 1997, and receiving the E. Scott Michigan Artist Prize for lifelong excellence and achievement.

"Some watercolors are difficult to paint because of the time involved ...Then there are paintings that are pure watercolors. They take such advantage of the medium that they couldn't be painted with anything but watercolor, such as this painting. The concept was simple and the painting time minimal, but all of the judgement, emotion and skill needed to make a watercolor had to be working all at once in a nerveracking 20 minutes instead of four weeks or four months. For an artist, it's a bit like diving off a high board as there is no turning back.

As the subject matter required two large washes of color to react with each other, the timing was crucial, and the humidity in the air had to be just right. All of it seemed to be pure luck, and the painting to be magically painting itself. I enjoy painting all types of watercolors, but the lucky ones are like receiving a gift."
