

Presidents Message

Greetings, WWS Members,

In this year of 2021, activity is hybrid: some events remain online only, some are mixed in-person and online and some are almost back to the way they were formerly. Locally, most plein air events went on as usual, including Peninsula School of Art's Plein Air in July and Cedarburg's in June. Gallery exhibits were installed but receptions tended to be scheduled online, such as Watercolor Wisconsin and our own fall show in New Visions. Cedarburg's Wine and Harvest Festival Art Fair and Madison's Art Fair on the Square were held in September with encouragement to wear masks and practice social distancing.

These changes put a premium on adapting to the changes in behavior and learning. Instead of throwing in the towel (or paint rag!) and giving up, we need to be proactive about using the new ways and must resign ourselves to the sidelines. In my work as an art therapist, we have a saying that we must "use it or lose it". While this usually refers to occupational and physical therapy, it is just as relevant to the success of artists. One can no longer apply to events without using computer platforms such as Zapplication and other Individual advertising and marketing reach programs. audiences through websites, online newsletters, Facebook, Instagram and other social media. When I became your president years ago, I did not know how to negotiate any of these changes. Yet, in order to get our business done, I learned by doing, investing time and the necessary tools, just like we did when learning to paint with watercolors. Some of us are retired from formal employment and have the time to devote to learning new ways. The best motivation comes from setting goals that have deadlines, such as dates by which to submit applications. We learn in our own experience how to proceed. The Wisconsin Watercolor Society needs to remain an actively exhibiting society in order to remain viable.

That said, your board will tackle planning for the future in a case by case method and I will continue to use email to keep everyone informed and up to date. Our Fall show was very beautifully presented and several members had work purchased by the Hospital for their new building project. It was a beautiful drive on the way to deliver paintings and a great new site for us, helping WWS reach areas outside of the Milwaukee vicinity. The trip to the Transparent Watercolor show in Kenosha was also worth the drive, showing artists who were chosen from the best national watercolor painters. We owe thanks to Joye Moon for arranging this outing!

Carpe Diem! Seize the days ahead to reenergize and re-learn!



Shirley Ann Schanen Gruen 1923 – 2020



Wisconsin Watercolor Society member Shirley Gruen, age 97, formerly of the town of Grafton, WI and Port Washington, WI passed away peacefully December 11, 2020 at the Harbor Club in Port Washington where she had been residing. Her legacy to her hometown will live as long as her paintings endure. The watercolor and acrylic images of seascapes, fish tugs and shanties, beaches, sailboats and street scenes that were her life's work constitute a visual history of Port Washington from the mid-20th century into the first decades of this century. In a career that spanned more than 75 years, Gruen began painting as a high school student and didn't set aside her sketch pad and brushes until she moved to an assisted living facility 4 years ago. In addition, Gruen opened a Franklin Street gallery that thrived for 39 years. Many a visitor to Port Washington left with a Gruen art print emblematic of the port's maritime character.

Gruen was a founding member of the Port Washington Historical Society and served on its first board of directors. While others knew her as a gifted painter and devoted supporter of her hometown, her family knew her, in the words of her son Gerald, as "a cheerful, optimistic person who loved her family, Port Washington, Lake Michigan, sailing, her art and the color blue".
